2022 Desautels Review Call for Law Student Papers in Private Enterprise & Law

The Desautels Review of Private Enterprise & Law is pleased to announce a new competition for the best paper in business law from JD/LLB candidates. Applicants are encouraged to submit a scholarly article that focuses on the integration of business, law, and the humanities as they apply to family controlled and other private enterprises in Canada.

The successful applicant will receive \$500 and their paper will be published in the Desautels Review of Private Enterprise and Law with a notation as the winning submission. The Call for Papers is sponsored by the Marcel A. Desautels Centre for Private Enterprise and the Law. The competition is open to JD/LLB candidates at Canadian law schools.

The Call for Law Student Papers aims to generate interest in the intersection of business, law, and the humanities among Canadian law students by recognizing and fostering student research in this significant and wide-ranging field. Business Law is a multi-faceted discipline, and this student research initiative aims to promote deeper understanding of the complex issues facing private enterprises in Canada.

Submissions may focus on any aspect of law and private enterprise within the broad scope of the Desautels Centre for Private Enterprise and the Law's integrated approach to the disciplines of business, law, and the humanities as they apply to family controlled and other private enterprises. Business Law broadly encompasses areas such as Law and Technology, Business Organizations, Business Transactions & Obligations, Financing & Insolvency, Alternative Dispute Resolution and more.

Eligibility and Submission Instructions

Students enrolled in full-time Bachelor of Laws (LLB) or Juris Doctorate (JD) programs at Canadian universities are eligible to apply. Submissions are due by June 17, 2022. Entries should be written in English and be accompanied by a completed application form. Papers must be no longer than 3,000 words, including footnotes. Submission Guidelines and Evaluation Criteria

Papers must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Papers must be no more than 3000 words in length, including footnotes;
- No bibliography or title page is required;
- Papers must focus on some aspect of law and private enterprise within the broad scope of the Desautels Review of Private Enterprise and Law;
- Papers must be written by a single author;
- Papers must be the author's own original work and unpublished in its submitted form; and
- Submissions must include an abstract (200 words maximum) and author biography (150 words maximum). The abstract and author biography are excluded from the 3000 word limit for the paper.

The following criteria will be used to evaluate submissions:

- Clarity and persuasiveness of thesis;
- Value or contribution to the scholarship in the chosen topic area;
- Originality and creativity;
- Doctrinal correctness;
- Depth of analysis;
- Organization and structure; and
- Writing quality.
